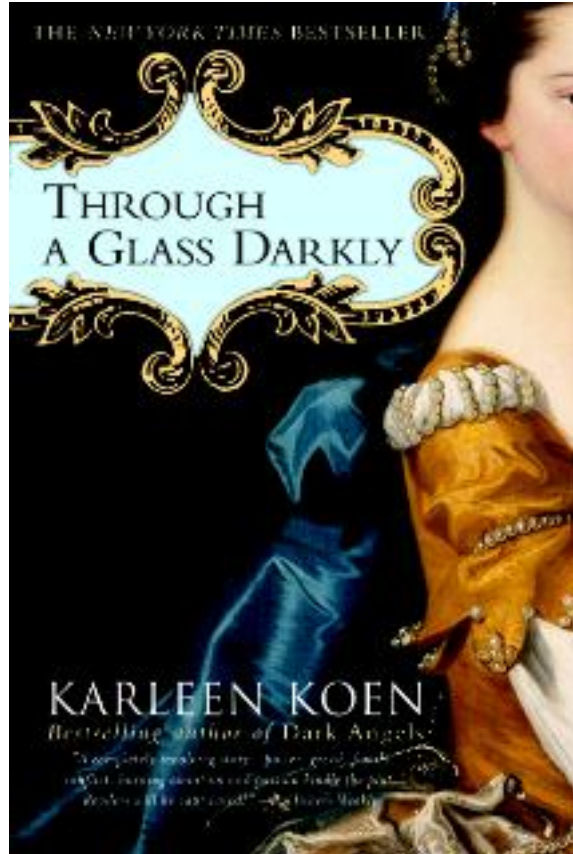


Sourcebooks Press Reprints

Sourcebooks has re-released Karleen Koen's first novel, *Through A Glass Darkly*. Set in England and France in the years 1715-1720, it's a coming-of-age story played out against the backdrop of a failed Jacobite rebellion, the early years of the reign of George I, and the South Sea Bubble.

First published by Random House, it was a *New York Times* best seller and a Book of the Month Club main selection. Under Sourcebooks' imprint, it was a summer pick of Costco's book club in 2007.
